

Ray Rice asked for a committee of volunteers to dig the holds to bury the anodes. The club has about a year and four months to get it finished.

Fuel Status — The club has about 125 gallons of avgas available, which will go away with just a few customers. Chad Williams will to get a price on a new load; the price is expected to be low at this time. Ray Rice will call the members on the list who owe money for fuel and ask them to pay up. The club is owed nearly \$3,000 for fuel; we will need to collect on these accounts to pay for a new load of fuel. Chad Williams will check into the price and delivery times available.

Marketing Report — Chuck Long reprinted the club's marketing piece, and Michael Mossman mailed out nearly 500 post cards. As of meeting date the club received only one phone call inquiry. There is one warbird owner based at Indianapolis Executive Airport that wants to move over; he is currently paying \$400 per month on rent, and it keeps going up. He would convert one of our hangars if the club were to offer a price guarantee. The general consensus was that we do not have a hangar that will fit his aircraft.

Treasurer's Report — Checking Account balance is \$3,810.15, savings account is \$5,437.97, and fuel account is \$8,238.99. Year to Date income is off budget by nearly \$1,000, partly because the club did not get any contributions from agricultural operations this year. Expenses are about \$2,800 over budget, mostly for the expenses spent on the grounds. Electricity is still up. Dick Gurley is still debating with Donovan and Sons on the accounting bill which was \$900; the previous bills were about \$400, more or less. Donovan & Sons was acquired by another accounting firm in Indianapolis and the rates went up.

Office Remodeling — The office remodeling committee will meet after the club's general business meeting. Club members are asked not to bring their junk and castoffs to the club, as it only becomes another club expense to get rid of it.

Local Aviation Event — Mark Poliak reported at the Indiana National Guard is hosting a reception party at Lebanon High School on Friday, October 14. They will have some Blackhawk helicopters land then a T-6 aircraft will fly over. The National Guard wants to include veterans and recruit high school students.

Aviation Scholarship — The Aviation Scholarship planning is progressing. The club hopes to have the program in place during the spring of 2017.

Club Equipment Report — Chuck Leucht painted the new covers for the fuel pump then installed the decals provided by Earl Brosman.

Adjournment — At the close of business Ray Rice declared the meeting adjourned.
